Uploading as a temporary sender

This section applies only to users who've been granted one-time access to upload exams. **NOTE:**

- ✓ The preferred internet browser to use for uploading your images is Google Chrome.

When you are invited to upload to lifeIMAGE as a temporary sender, you receive an email like the one shown below.

Click on "Login to your account" to get started.

Google Chrome is lifeIMAGE's preferred browser for uploading exams because it does not require Java. Firefox and Internet Explorer users will need to launch our Java applet to upload exams.

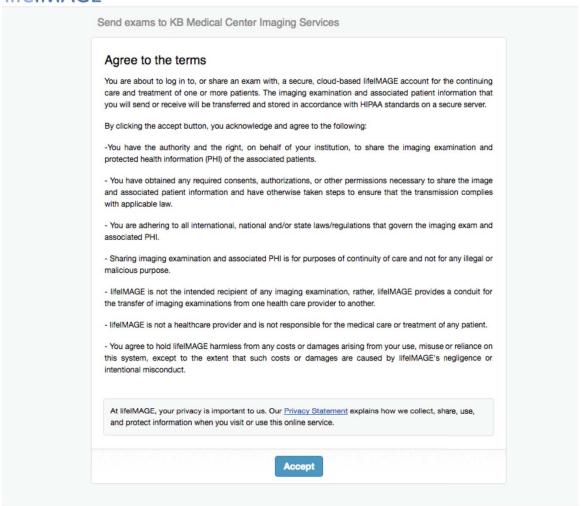

After accepting the agreement, the lifeIMAGE uploader will attempt to launch. You may see a message like this related to Java. Scroll to the bottom to 'Run this time" and continue.



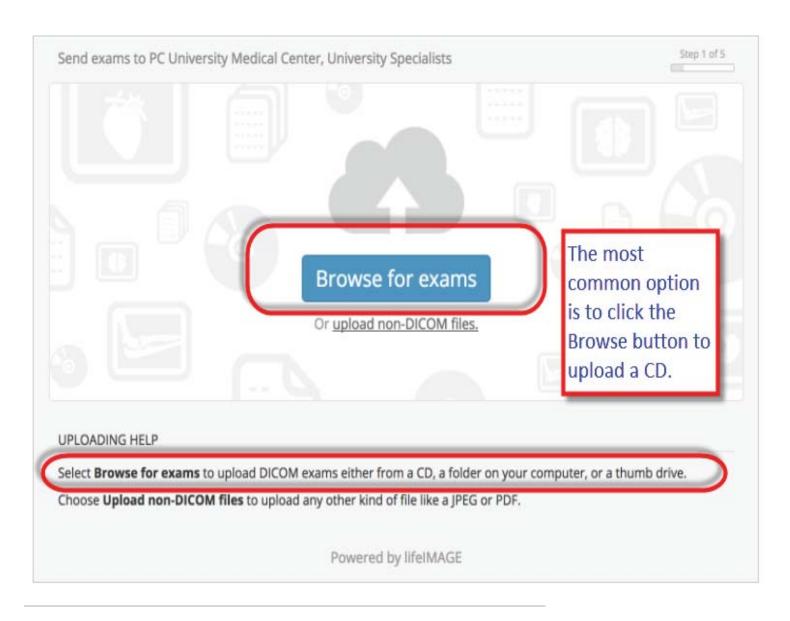
Note: If you wait too long, this message will disappear from the bottom of the web page, refresh your browser to have the pop-up message appear again.

Once the Java or HTML5 uploader is running, you are brought to this screen, where you are asked to choose a source from where to upload images. For Windows users, the application will automatically look for images on a CD, if one is inserted. If you have not yet inserted a CD, you can do so now.

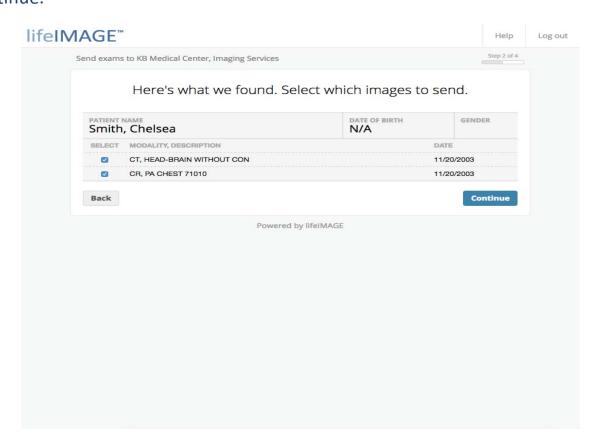
Step 1

Select <u>Browse for exams to upload exams from a CD</u>, a folder on your computer, or a thumb drive.

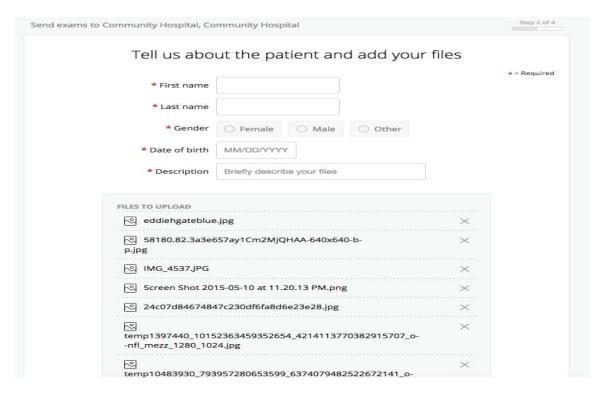
Choose Upload non-DICOM files to upload any other kind of file like a JPEG, or PDF.



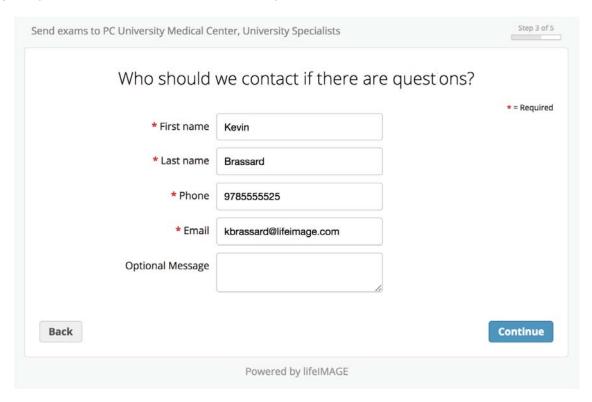
In Step 2, if an exam is found, you are asked to select which of the detected exams to upload. In the case of multiple exams, you can uncheck any that are not relevant and click Continue.



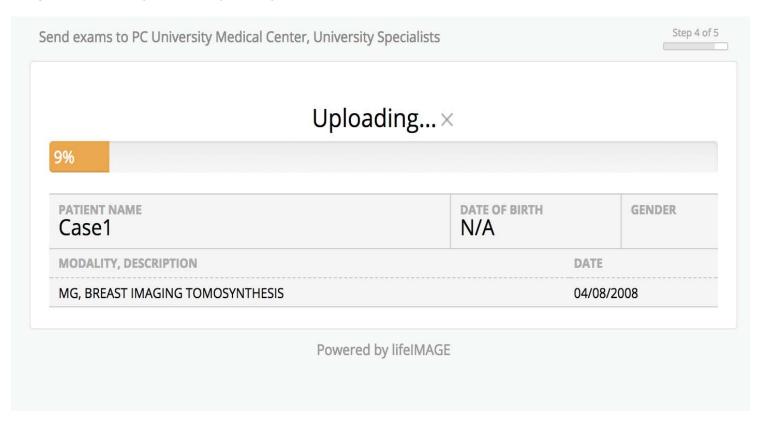
If JPEGs are detected, the screen below is shown to you.



In Step 3, you are asked to fill in the required contact fields.



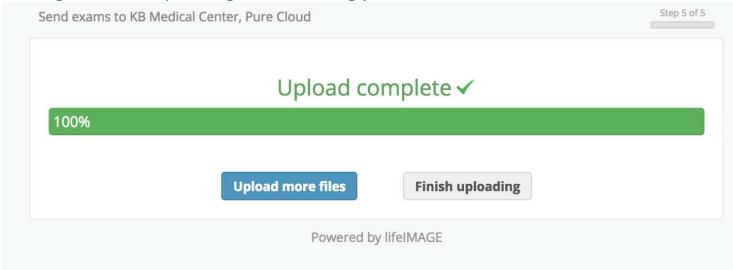
Step 4 is where you will upload your exams and/or non-DICOM files:



When uploading exams using a web browser, lifeIMAGE scans the source location for reports. If any reports are detected, they'll appear on the receiver's copy of the exam's Documents tab once the exam.

Once your upload is complete, you have the option to upload more exams or log out.

- Clicking on the Upload more exams button allows you to start at step 1 and select an exam or non-DICOM files for upload.
- Clicking the Finish Uploading button will log you out of the session.



• Once you log out, your temporary credential can no longer be used. If additional images need to be uploaded, a new request must be made.
